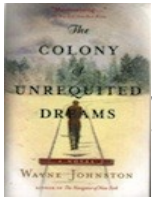

Public Safety Alert: Toronto Police request assistance with break and enter investigation

The Toronto Police Service would like to make the public aware of an increase in overnight break and enter occurrences in the area bounded by Bayview Avenue on the west, Steeles Avenue on the north, Leslie Street on the east and Sheppard Avenue on the south.

It is reported that: during September and October 2010, the suspect(s) have broken into residential homes overnight.

Police are reminding homeowners to keep all windows and doors secured, even when they are at home, in particular basement and main level windows and doors.

Homeowners with residential alarms are also reminded that they should be arming their security systems at all times, even when they are home.

Residents are also asked to check the perimeter of their home if their alarm is triggered and report anything suspicious to the police.

The suspicious activity would include, but is not limited to, people in green spaces late at night, an unknown person on their property or their neighbour's property at any time of the day, any fresh damage to their doors or window screens. If there is any doubt, please call police for advice.

Investigators are asking property owners to check their property, in particular garden sheds for property that might have been left behind by the suspects.
